### Bible Story

Joseph in Jail  
(Genesis 39–40)

### Remember This

“For I know the plans I have  
for you,” says the Lord.”  
Jeremiah 29:11, NLT

### Say This

Who has a plan for you?  
God has a plan for me.

## Activity 1

### In Charge

- No supplies needed

Ask everyone to stand up and let them know that they must follow the video host and mimic what she does. If you would like to continue the game after Church @ Home, choose a family member to be the new leader and “in charge.” Continue with the activity by allowing everyone a turn to be “in charge.”

## Activity 2

### What Happened Next?

#### What You Need

- Story pictures. Print them in color [here](#). Print them B&W [here](#)
- Scissors

#### What You Do

**(Hold up the picture where Potiphar is happy with Joseph.)** “Look for this picture of Potiphar. He’s smiling at Joseph because Joseph always worked hard and did what Potiphar told him to do. What happened next?”

**(Hold up the picture of angry Potiphar with Joseph.)** “Look for this picture, this is Potiphar again, only this time he has an angry face. Someone told him that Joseph had done something wrong, even though he didn’t do anything wrong. Potiphar got mad and sent Joseph to jail! What happened next?”

**(Hold up the picture of Joseph in jail.)** “Now, look for this picture of Joseph in jail. It was a very hard time for Joseph, but he still trusted that God loved him and had a plan for him. So, instead of being mad or sad, Joseph helped everyone he could while he was in jail.

**(Hold up the ‘God has a plan for me’ card.)** “Okay, I have this card left. Do you see a picture? No. But it does have some very important words. This card says, ‘God has a plan for me.’ You can put this card at the end to remind us that God’s plans are always good!”

Give each family member their very own story cards. Everyone needs to put their story cards in the order they happened in the story.

## Prayer

“Dear God, thank You for *(child’s name)*. I know You have a plan for them, because you love them. I pray they will always trust that You have a plan for them. And when hard things happen, help them to wait on You, do the right thing, and trust in Your plan for them. We love You, God. In Jesus’ name, amen.”
